Help Me Grow is a voluntary program for pregnant women and families with infants and toddlers between the ages of birth and three years old. The goal of the program is to assure that newborns, infants, and toddlers have the best possible start in life. Help Me Grow provides services that promote children's growth and development and support families during their children's early years.

A **Help Me Grow** Worker can make visits to your home to provide you with information about community services and resources for Geauga Families. Your child will also be screened for health and overall development to make sure he/she meets important milestones.

The purpose of **Help Me Grow** is to help parents help their children reach their fullest potential because the first three years of life are so important to a child's overall educational, social, and emotional development.

# Blowing bubbles to promote speech

Blowing bubbles encourages breath support which is needed to talk in sentences. It also helps strengthen the muscles needed for common speech sounds. This activity teaches lip puckering and lip rounding which assists in the production of m', p', b' and w' sounds.

### Target Vocabulary:

Bubbles, more, want, pop, blow, big, small, please, pole, me, up, bye-bye, wet, open, whoa, wow, watch, my turn/your turn, in/out, on/off, dip and all done.

## Activities to teach the concept of blowing:

- \* Hand: Put your hand to your mouth and say 'I can feel air on my hand'. Let your child try. This allows your child to feel the airflow.
- \* <u>Tissue</u>: Place approximately 1-2 inches away from your mouth and exhale. Point to the tissue moving and say 'Did you see that! Air cam out of my mouth." This shows your child that they need to exhale—Also needed for blowing bubbles and speech production
- \* Mirror: Position close to mouth to create condensations you speak. Watch the mirror fog up! This also provides visual feedback.
- \* <u>Bubbles</u>: Blow a bubble and catch it on the bubble wand. See if your child can kiss the bubble. Next, see if your child can blow the bubble off the wand by softly saying 'who'.
- \* <u>Straw</u>: Submerge in a cup of water and show your child how to make bubbles by blowing into the straw.
- \* <u>Cotton Ball</u>: Place at one end of table and try to blow to the other end. Make it a game—try to see whose cotton ball can reach the end first!

Be silly, animated and most of all HAVE FUN!!



# Exploring with Playdough

Playdough is fun, versatile and an invaluable tool for working on goals with your child at home. For tactile sensitivities, Playdough is a great way to bridge the gap between comfortable sensations such as hard/firm textures and uncomfortable sensations such as soft, sticky and mushy textures. It can be used in a variety of ways to introduce sensory exploration. There is no right or wrong way to play with playdough as long as your child is having fun and using their hands to explore.

### Activities that promote this are

- When playing with playdough; squish, squash, roll and flatten the dough. This develops children's muscles that will encourage prewriting skills.
- Use play scissors, cookie cutters, and rolling pins to encourage play activities like tea parties, snowmen building, and pretend baking. This will help to develop skills like cutting while also developing hand muscles.
- Roll out dough in pancake shape and with plastic knife and fork practice cutting in small pieces. This helps with coordination.

Kool Aid Playdough Recipe

3 1/2 Cups Flour 1/4 Cup Salt 2 packs Unsweetened Kool-Aid

3 Tbls. Oil 2 Cups boiling water

PLAY

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In a bowl, add water to salt and Kool-Aid. Add Flour and oil. Knead until smooth. Keep in airtight container.
